Here is an interesting hand from Bank Holiday Monday duplicate submitted by Danny. Hand 1: Hands rotated for convenience.

This is an interesting deal involving a squeeze. Usually, it is not clear that a squeeze will be available as it requires certain cards to be favourably placed. On this hand, it is possible to determine with a high degree of certainty where the key cards are and put the defender in question in an impossible situation.

After the DA lead, a switch to Clubs, and the SA by Declarer, it is good play to take an early finesse of the HJ, which is successful. Declarer now knows that the HK and DK are with West, and this sets the scene for a squeeze.

Declarer then finesses against the SQ (a 'restricted choice' situation after the SJ fell on the first round of Spades), draws the last trump, and plays King and Queen of Clubs. He can then ruff a Diamond back to hand and play his last two trumps (Spades).

When he plays his penultimate trump, these are the remaining key cards :

West is caught in a Triple Squeeze! Declarer has three more winners (2 Spades and HA), and any discard allows Declarer to make a further trick:

If West discards the C10, declarer's C5 becomes a winner.

If West discards DK, declarer's DQ becomes a winner.

If West discards H8, the KH will drop on the HA, and the HQ becomes a winner.
