Hannah, a much-decorated amateur, a graduate of Oklahoma

State University, was delighted with her first professional win. It sets her up nicely for her forthcoming trip to South Africa where she will play in two tour events in Johannesburg (Modderfontein) and at Somerset West (Erinvale) in the Cape. Following this she is off to Korea and tour events in the Far East.

The runner-up and leading amateur was highly-commended Hyun-Ji Kim, aged 18 from Royal

Wimbledon, who carded two rounds of 72 for level par 144.

Second professional, third overall, was Thalia Kirby from Harleyford Golf Club on 148 (72,76).

Third professional Jae Bowers on 150 (71,79).

Second amateur and seventh overall was Ella Butteriss from Beaconsfield with 151 (75,76).

On Sunday Ella was among 19 players from the Gold Cup who went on to compete in the Hampshire Rose at North Hants Golf Club in the second half of the Gold Rose Trophy, accruing double points on the women's amateur tour. Ella had two rounds of 75 to add to her scores at Roehampton Club to win the double by four shots from Hyun-Ji Kim.
