Main Exhibition – preparation and evolution

- The maximum size of entries will be 80cm X 80cm, including the frame.
- We have been encouraging artists to paint their own original compositions; these may be influenced by the techniques, styles and colours of other artists; but we do not want entries which are copies of famous artworks.
