#### England v Spain Golf Croquet Test Match, 21 – 23 June

The long-awaited Test Match for which planning began in November last year, finally started with the Opening Ceremony at 10.00 on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June, with play starting straight after. The Test is played over three days. There are 27 matches, (18 singles, 9 doubles). Each match is the best-of-three 13- point games. The teams were selected earlier this year and the players seeded by world ranking grades on 31 May 2024. For the doubles, team captains decided their pairings, which were then seeded based on combined grades for each pairing.

The lawns and the surroundings were immaculate, a testament to the extra efforts from the ground staff in the week prior to the event, which produced a surface playing at 11.5 to 12 on the 'stimp meter', in the mornings which increased as the day went on.

The event was 'live streamed' on YouTube and one end of the Croquet Pavilion resembled a TV Production Studio, and a commentary tent was next to the building. You can still watch the match by going into YouTube – England v. Spain Croquet 2024.

The spectators were treated to some outstanding Golf Croquet from both sides with a range of shots demonstrating all aspects of the game. I did think we should have had a scoreboard similar to the one in Cricket's T20 which records the number of 6's hit, but in our case, for the number of Jump Shots! Some of the most impressive coming from Tobi Savage (England). England were victorious, winning the Test Match by 17 games to 10 to retain the Trophy.

All the players and officials were very complimentary and grateful for all the planning, presentation and hospitality from the Roehampton Club and Croquet Section, who made the event such a success.
