Review of 2024 matches and fixtures for 2025

At this time of year, we have an opportunity to look back at the season and record what has gone well and what has been less successful. We will have played a full programme of 22 matches this season, with only 21 results as our trip to the RAC in Epsom in April was abandoned mid round due to wind and hail. After a disappointing series of losses in mid-season, a recent run of four successive victories leaves the season with seven wins, 10 losses and two halved matches, with two matches still to be played. The matches are great fun and so I urge those who have not taken part this year to sign up to the senior squad on Intelligent Golf and make themselves available for next year's matches. Next year we already have 22 fixtures planned, so there should be opportunities for most seniors to play for the team.

Also, within the ambit of seniors golf, a Roehampton Club team led by Nigel Brown has reached the final of the John Ling Salver – a competition which the team won a couple of years ago. Weekly competitions in 2024

We have held competitions every Wednesday throughout the year, with modified roll-ups and Grails every month plus two Medals, in spring and autumn. I have reported regularly on the winners of those competitions in the course of the year.

This year we have been able to play to a finish all our regular knockouts. Some seniors have had particularly successful years. There are always some serial winners. Nigel Brown won the Colum Sharkey Cup and the Ockleshaw Cup. Obviously his matchplay skills have been honed by his experience leading the Roehampton Club team in the John Ling Salver. To cap it all he was the winner of the Annual Medal, having done well in both the spring and autumn events.

John Tyrwhitt has also had a good year, winning the Ockleshaw Plate, the August Grail and recording the best gross score in the summer Eclectic. I should also mention that my long-time playing companion, Ian Taylor-Restell won the Hamid Lari Trophy for the Summer Eclectic for the umpteenth time!
