Goodbye, January Blues—welcome February with lighter mornings and the promise of spring ahead! We've had some stunning crisp, frosty mornings, which may mean carryonly until the frost lifts, but the beauty of the course more than makes up for it.



Changes to Handicap Requirements

To ensure fair competition and align with **Surrey Women's Golf** regulations, we are **increasing the minimum number of qualifying cards** required for our **Trophy and Knockout Competitions**

Effective immediately:

- Players must submit at least two qualifying competition rounds plus one other card within the last 12 months to be eligible for trophy competitions.
- Players who do not meet the requirements may still participate but will not be eligible to win a trophy.
- Knockout competitions will require the same minimum criteria to enter

From the autumn, ahead of the Winter Knockouts, this will increase to **three qualifying competition rounds**. The Committees will regularly review the minimum number of qualifying cards required

Many clubs require significantly more qualifying rounds—some up to **12 per year!** While we aren't suggesting such a high number, this modest increase will help ensure fairer competition and more accurate handicaps.

Copper Knockout and Mixed Knockout

We are **reintroducing the Copper Knockout** for players with handicaps between **29.0** and **36.0**. The same handicap requirements apply: two qualifying cards plus one other.

For the **Mixed Knockout**, if you need a playing partner, let me know—I'll do my best to find you a suitable partner!

New Senior Ladies Winter Competition - Trial

With the wet and muddy conditions making golf more challenging, we know some players aren't enjoying their rounds as much. So, on **Tuesday, 4th March**, following the Stableford, with separate competition and tee times, we will trial a **non-qualifying Stableford for the Over-70s**, playing from the beginning of the fairway.

If it proves popular, we will look to run more of these events in the winter months.

Surrey Knockouts

Entries for the **Surrey Knockouts** are now open until **Friday, 7th March**. These competitions are a fantastic way to meet new players and experience different courses in Surrey. All players who wish to enter a SWG competition must be in possession of a current, registered WHS handicap. They must have played three qualifying rounds (not including cards used to gain their Initial Handicap Index) in the previous 12 months prior to the date of each match.

With the soft ground, divots and pitch marks are more common.

Please **repair them when you see them**—not just your own! A pitch mark repaired within **24 hours** recovers quickly, but left unattended, it takes **over three weeks** to heal.

Did you know? **Repairing three pitch marks brings good luck!** If you want extra luck, you now know what to do!



Additionally, the **Course Marshalls** have been using **Tag Marshall** to monitor pace of play. A good pace of play benefits us all—we need to aim for rounds of **3 hours 45 minutes**. If you consistently find yourself playing slowly, please consider **teeing off later in the day** to avoid holding up the field.
